WELCOME

To the picturesque historic village of Millthorpe

Millthorpe is 3.5 hours from Sydney and Canberra, 30 minutes from Bathurst and 20 minutes from Orange – an ideal weekend getaway. The village boasts award winning restaurants, arts and antiques, a museum, boutique shops, hotels, wine tasting and accommodation enhancing its charm, sophistication and eclectic style. Millthorpe is located in Central NSW in the heart of a dynamic food and cool climate wine region, a centre for truffle production, is home to a vibrant community of local artists and has a diverse range of talented people living and working in the village.

Established in the pioneering era, Millthorpe has a rich agricultural history, a legacy of grand buildings, heritage architecture and a streetscape that has remained largely unchanged since the early 1900's. The entire village is classified by the National Trust and the village centre has cobbled, bluestone bordered streets. Millthorpe is a living museum being home to a community of about 700 people and comes alive on weekends with locals, visitors and tourists alike.

Millthorpe is set in a rural landscape amongst gently rolling hills with Mount Canobolas in the distance a majestic backdrop. At 965m above sea

level Millthorpe's elevation ensures a distinct four seasons experience. Winter sees cold nights and open fires with frosty mornings and snowfalls, spring brings green blossoming countryside with crisp nights, summer is a time of outdoor entertaining under magical starry skies and autumn delivers a spectacular display of colour. With such a rich heritage and seasonal climate, fabulous food, wine and wonderful people it's always a great time to visit Millthorpe.

Take a step back in time, spend some time at the museum, take a stroll around the streets of Millthorpe and experience a place where horse and cart were tethered to verandah posts, locals chat on street corners and children play in the streets. Relax, unwind and soak up the beauty and elegance of a bygone era.

HERITAGE

From Forest to Farm

The quiet country village of Millthorpe today disguises the bustling history of a community that built an independent, determined character over the past 170 plus years with vigour and tenacity. There were only a few isolated settlers here until two important events occurred. First, the discovery of payable gold at Ophir in 1851 by William Tom and John Lister (who is buried in



Millthorpe) and then the Robertson's Land Act of 1861. These two events stimulated an explosion of interest in the area and the beginnings of a partnership of mutual benefit between agriculture, mining and the local community which persists today, though in a form that is quite different to the pioneering days.

Village Foundations

The earliest signs of village life appear to have been a slab and bark schoolhouse built by members of the Church of England in 1867. Schoolmaster William Webb, who was appointed as teacher in 1869, proved to be a pillar of the fledgling community and remained so for the thirty years of his tenure. The local Farmers Union of the time was a progressive group which hosted a demonstration of a new steam threshing machine in 1880 and subsequently decided that a Flour Mill would be an astute investment for the district. Originally planned to be built at Spring Hill, the Mill site was changed to Spring Grove (now Millthorpe) by just one vote as some of the Spring Hill Union members failed to attend the decisive meeting. In recognition of the Mill project a community meeting was called to debate a change of name from the ubiquitous "Spring ... " to one reflecting the importance placed on the Mill and distinguishing this community clearly from all the "Spring" named communities which surrounded it. Again a close result by just 38 votes to 31 the decision was made and the Millthorpians prevailed, again!

The Golden Years

The ultimate jewel in Millthorpe's crown was the coming of the railway line in 1877 and the construction of a station in 1886. The Mill depended on the railway and the local farmers cutting chaff for a rapidly expanding Sydney. Millthorpe became one of the largest rail centres in the State shipping flour, chaff and later peas and potatoes to Sydney and other markets. It was during this time of prosperity and industry in the late 19th and early 20th centuries that the physical form of the village we know today, took shape. Imposing and beautiful buildings were built to serve the commercial, agricultural and community needs of the district and of course many still stand today

Reinventing the Village

As the 20th century arrived the commercial world changed forever. Chaff was no longer needed, the grain industry moved on and the potato market also relocated. So the lovely historic buildings of Millthorpe were left alone as development moved to the larger population centres and bypassed the village. Millthorpe almost died. But in doing so, it preserved a legacy of the golden years, a wonderful streetscape which proved to be a perfect fit with the late 20th and early 21st century market shift to tourism, food and wine as powerful attractions for the village.

Village / Country Walk (3km - 40mins)

Heading North on Park Street past the Public School, Museum & Fire Station you come to Redmond Oval, the Anglican & Catholic Churches and local Cemetery. John Lister's grave is in the cemetery and there is a rewarding view to Mt Canobolas from the top of the cemetery.

Richards Lane to the left takes you around to the North Western corner of the Village to Crowson Street, the Great Western Mill site by the railway line and up Victoria Street to the Grand Western Lodge and Pym Street shops. Just a few more metres and you're back by beautiful Rosebank and the Post Office start point.

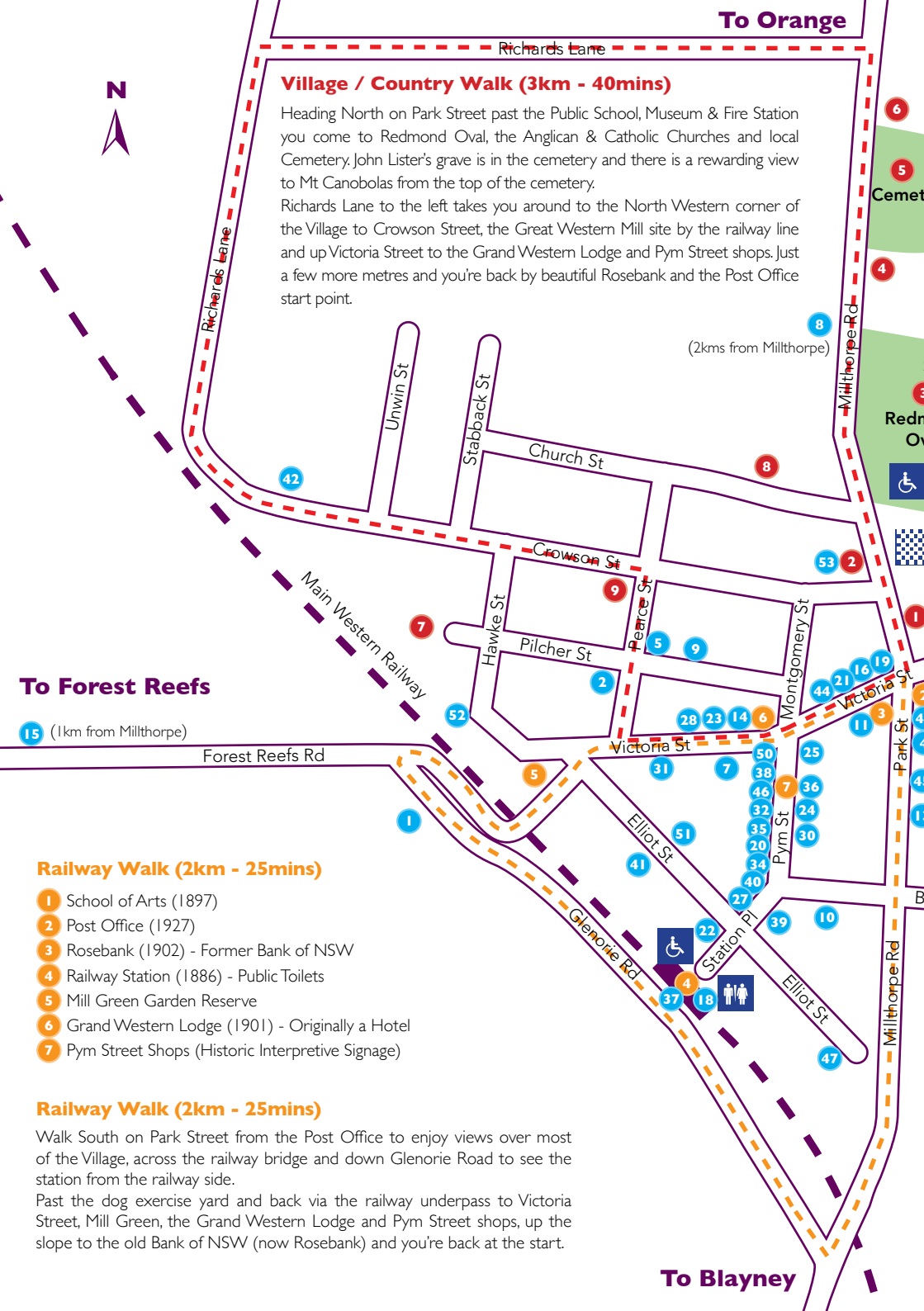

Railway Walk (2km - 25mins)

Walk South on Park Street from the Post Office to enjoy views over most of the Village, across the railway bridge and down Glenorie Road to see the station from the railway side.

Past the dog exercise yard and back via the railway underpass to Victoria Street, Mill Green, the Grand Western Lodge and Pym Street shops, up the slope to the old Bank of NSW (now Rosebank) and you're back at the start.
